2020/2021 Covid Emergency Grants



The Townwide Fund provided assistance to house Covid patients who needed to quarantine.
Family Service League offers family counseling, educational, vocational, advocacy and therapeutic programs to people of all ages, social and economic groups, giving hope and strength to families.



The Townwide Fund redirected Gurwin's 2019-2020 for Covid-related needs.
The Gurwin Jewish Nursing & Rehabilitation Center is a 460-bed skilled nursing care facility, and is part of the Gurwin Healthcare System, a renowned healthcare provider offering a full continuum of healthcare and senior living services.



The Townwide Fund provided a grant to stock the Mission's food pantry in the early days of the pandemic.
Helping Hand Rescue Mission is a community outreach organization providing emergency food, clothing and personal items to those in need.



The Townwide Fund provided funds for hot meals for Huntington's homebound.
Housing Help is a HUD certified Housing Counseling Service 501c(3). They provide workshops, counseling, intervention and education, assisting to helping families obtain safe, decent, affordable housing, avoid foreclosure and develop financial skills to become a stable household.



The Townwide Fund supported mental health counseling for low-income clients.
Living Waters Counseling Center is addressing the overwhelming need of holistic mental health care for individuals and families with low-moderate income. They provide counseling services for children, adults, couples and families living with abuse, trauma, addiction and dealing with a full range of the human experience.



The Townwide Fund provided grocery gift cards for low-income families impacted by Covid.
Tri Community and Youth Agency provides educational, recreational, and advocacy services to youth living at or below the poverty line. In addition to these services, Tri-CYA provides daily lunchtime meals for both children and their families.



The Townwide Fund provided funds to support child care for first responders.
Huntington YMCA provides activities that include cultural arts programs, aquatic programs, summer day camp, pre-school classes, sports instruction, and fitness and cardiovascular programs — all intended to improve the quality of life that builds strong spirit, mind and body.

The Townwide Fund provided funding to supplement self-pay patients while copays were suspended during pandemic.
Huntington Hospital provides healthcare services with an emphasis on cancer, cardiology, maternity/neonatal care and specialized surgical procedures. The hospital's annex, the Dolan Family Health Center, provides outpatient health care to the medically indigent in the community.



The Townwide Fund provides funding for youth programs, backpacks, nutrition and tutoring.
Family Service League offers family counseling, educational, vocational, advocacy and therapeutic programs to people of all ages, social and economic groups, giving hope and strength to families.

The Townwide Fund supports reimbursement of costs which permit seniors to connect with Huntington students.

Foster Grandparent Program pairs seniors who live in the Huntington area with children in Huntington elementary schools and pre-school who are in need of extra academic help and/or emotional assistance.



The Townwide Fund provides funding for seeds and equipment to grow food which directly benefits the needs of Huntington residents.

The Gateway Community Garden consists of over 140 gardening beds and provides freshly grown vegetables to local food banks. Through part-time workers, volunteers, and workshops for both children and adults, the Garden harvests and donates over 1,000 pounds of vegetables valued at over \$3,000 yearly.



The Townwide Fund provides funds to purchase basic clothing for veterans in need.

The monthly Distributions with Dignity program provides the veterans currently housed at the Salvation Army Annex in the Northport VAMC with personal undergarments, toiletries, and seasonal items that they cannot afford.



The Townwide Fund provides funding to train a dog for a local sight-impaired person.

The Guide Dog Foundation provides trained service dogs free of charge to the visually impaired and veterans with physical and mental disabilities. It is also an advocate for making all public areas accessible to the disabled and their service dogs.



The Townwide Fund provides funding for the purchase of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to protect residents, patients and staff.

The Townwide Fund helps support HBAC's Lend a Helping Hand Program, which helps Huntington women obtain direct services including housekeeping, transportation and groceries during treatment.

Huntington Breast Cancer Action Coalition is a grassroots organization dedicated to raising awareness and educating the public on the prevention and cure of breast cancer, as well as helping those who are faced with a positive diagnosis.



The Townwide Fund supports scholarships to YMCA Camp for youngsters in need.

Huntington YMCA provides activities that include cultural arts programs, aquatic programs, summer day camp, pre-school classes, sports instruction, and fitness and cardiovascular programs — all intended to improve the quality of life that builds strong spirit, mind and body.



The Townwide Fund supports the program which brings healthy food, products and support services to local residents through their Food Collection and Distribution Program.

Island Harvest Food Bank is dedicated to hunger-relief efforts through food collection and distribution as well as nutrition education, job training, leadership advocacy and outreach, and promoting hunger awareness.



The Townwide Fund supports the Lift Fund, helping families with one-time assistance.

The Junior Welfare League of Huntington has provided financial assistance to Huntington's less fortunate for over 80 years. Through seven core programs, the Junior Welfare League has supported children, the elderly, and low-income families.

The Townwide Fund supports Huntington's food pantry with emergency food for veterans and other residents in need.

Long Island Cares Inc., The Harry Chapin Food Bank provides supplies and products to food pantries, soup kitchens, and emergency shelters as well as supporting day care centers and senior nutrition sites; assists low-income single heads of families and at-risk young adults to gain job skills, vocational training, and eventual employment.



The Townwide Fund provides funding for a community project educating people on how to spot abuse and how to help a family member in abusive situation.

Long Island Against Domestic Violence dedicates all of its efforts to providing safety and support to victims of family violence by offering preventative and supportive services.



The Townwide Fund provides funding toward "summer camperships in a box" to keep girls engaged during the pandemic.

North Shore Holiday House enrolls over 200 girls throughout Long Island in a summer camp that promotes the values of self-reliance, confidence, and teamwork.



The Townwide Fund provides funds to support youth service projects such as food drives, care packages for the homeless, and sandwiches for low income residents.

REACH provides youth development and child care services to Huntington residents and their families, instilling values of leadership, compassion, and social awareness. It is REACH-CYA's mission to promote self-development, deter delinquency, and create a warmer future.



The Townwide Fund donated funds towards the purchase of IV and wound care equipment.

St. Johnland Nursing Center is a skilled nursing center that provides home and day health-care services and social day care, as well as sub-acute care and specialized care for traumatic brain injury and dementia.



The Townwide Fund provided funds to upgrade WIFI and technology for remote learning.

Suffolk Y-JCC offers programs for children which include infant day care, before- and after-school programs, and summer day camp, programs for families and adults from cultural, social and support groups to physical fitness, and programs for those with special needs.



The Townwide Fund provides funds towards programs for children of low-income families.

Tri Community and Youth Agency provides educational, recreational, and advocacy services to youth living at or below the poverty line. In addition to these services, Tri-CYA provides daily lunchtime meals for both children and their families.



The Townwide Fund provides funds for acupuncture for pain control and symptom management in hospice patients which is not reimbursed by insurance.

Visiting Nurse Service & Hospice of Suffolk offers in-home care to housebound patients by registered nurses, occupational therapists and certified home health aides. It also offers terminally ill patients the choice of staying in its new, fully staffed in-patient hospice house.



The Townwide Fund provides funding to purchase supplies and equipment and to teach healthy cooking classes to youth venturing off on their own for the first time, as well as for the cooking component to their "Home Alone" series for 11-14 year-old students.

Youth Direction & Alternatives empowers youth throughout Elwood, Harborfields, Northport, and East Northport with self-esteem, positive energy, and motivation to follow constructive life paths.

Harborfields Alliance for Community Outreach

The Townwide Fund provides funding to support the outreach program.

Harborfields Alliance for Community Outreach is a program targeting free and reduced lunch kids who are in the Harborfields School District.



The Townwide Fund grant supports enhancement of services in three of their specialized town-wide projects including Project Excel, Huntington Youth Court and Sanctuary.

HYBYDRI's Project Excel provides youth service projects, employment, tutoring, GED training in the creative arts and college prep), Huntington Youth Court is an alternative to the juvenile justice system, and Sanctuary offers prevention and crisis services for youth at risk of becoming runaways or homeless.



The Townwide Fund provides funding to purchase tablets to enable off-site financial literacy and credit counseling meetings during the pandemic.

Housing Help is a HUD certified Housing Counseling Service 501c(3). They provide workshops, counseling, intervention and education, assisting to helping families obtain safe, decent, affordable housing, avoid foreclosure and develop financial skills to become a stable household.



The Townwide Fund provides a grant to support Thanksgiving baskets for 60 families.

The Kiwanis of Huntington Children's Foundation, part of Kiwanis International is a club set out to help the children of Huntington with camp scholarships, food drives and a holiday shopping program.



The Townwide Fund provides funds to assist Huntington residents in taking the Citizen Preparation Test with application assistance, cleaning supplies and scholarships.

The Opening Word teaches immigrant women (English as another language, citizenship and career development) with the support of volunteer teachers. Opening Word is a sponsored ministry of the Sisters of St. Dominic of Amityville, and is located on the premises of St. Hugh's Church.



The Townwide Fund supports purchase of equipment to help serve hundreds of hungry residents and provide sustenance and respite to those in need.

Temple Beth-El serves the hungry and homeless through three programs: Project Hope aka "Sunday Supper," Huntington Interfaith Homeless initiative (HIHI), and a large dinner program three times a year: Thanksgiving Dinner, Spaghetti Dinner and a Summer BBQ.



The Townwide Fund helps support monetary assistance for the disabled, abused women and very low-income families.

Society of St. Vincent de Paul is a nonprofit, human services organization, providing direct financial and material aid to carefully vetted people in need through various programs.



The Townwide Fund provided funds to purchase touchless faucets in veteran group homes to prevent Covid spread.

United Veterans Beacon House was established to help those who bravely served our country. They provide housing and wraparound supportive services to veterans and their families, helping to create a fresh start and opportunities for growth in their communities.
